

How to make: A Mini Woodland Garden

Embark on a treasure hunt in the garden or during a woodland walk with this delightful and effortless activity! Engage in sustainable foraging for stones, fallen greenery and twigs, ideally in the early morning hours, to ensure freshness and vibrancy. Store your finds in a cool, damp location until it is time to use them. Enhance the charm of your mini woodland by adding in miniature dinosaurs or delicate fairies for an added touch of whimsy!

Step 1: Assemble your magical woodland kit! You will need: all-purpose compost, a shallow container with drainage holes, drainage stones, a few pebbles and greenery.

Venture outdoors to gather fallen twigs —bonus points for leafy ones as mini trees! Look out for fallen foliage, bark and small woodland plants in shady hideouts, and mossy patches from shadowy walls. Happy foraging! Please always forage sustainably with the landowner's permission.

Step 2: Pop some stones or crocks over the drainage hole, then fill the container with compost, leaving a 3 cm gap at the top for watering. Time to unleash your inner artist! Craft a winding river of slate flowing from a majestic mountain of stones, with trees peeking from afar.

Step 3: Sprinkle in some extra green magic with fronds of fern and pine needles for a pop of contrasting foliage. Bark was added for some textural flair.

Step 4: Moss and a few more finishing touches will complete the woodland. Display it in dappled shade for that extra touch of forest magic. Keep the greenery hydrated to ensure a fresh appearance.

And watch as the stones and pebbles glisten with life when given a refreshing splash of water!
